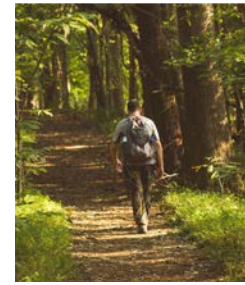




BLEDSOE CREEK STATE PARK

PARK DESCRIPTION

Bledsoe Creek State Park is rich in history. It was once a prime hunting ground for the Cherokee, Creek, Shawnee and Chickamauga Native American tribes. Once English settlers arrived to the area, the once great herds of animals were dispersed, never to return. The area is home to a wealth of Native American history along with various historical sites nearby. The Bledsoe Creek territory became a Tennessee State Park in 1973.

HOSTING DESCRIPTION

Campground Description

There are three camp host positions, all in the Main Campground

The Main Campground is located off the main park road after passing through a security gate and day use area. It is centrally located in the park with an approximate 3 mile hiking trail on the perimeter.

This campground is comprised of 58 sites offering power and water as well as 19 primitive sites and 2 group camp areas. There is a dump station located on the main park road. Two bathhouses with updated fixtures and showers are located in the campground. The park offers two playgrounds, two boat ramps and a courtesy fishing dock. Laundry facilities are located in the maintenance building.

Responsibilities

Each of the three host positions share the same responsibilities

1. Check-in of campers and assign walk-in overnight sites
2. Light maintenance and housekeeping of campground facilities to include cleaning fire ring, blowing off sites and removing trash
3. Sell firewood and ice to campers on behalf of Friends of Bledsoe Creek State Park to include cash handling
4. Inform campers of park activities & programs, as well as park rules and regulations
5. Direct campers to local points of interest and services
6. Communicate items of interest or concern within campground to Park Manager and staff.

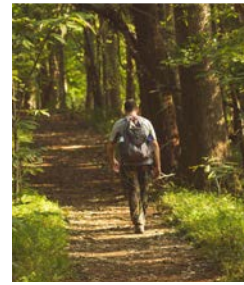

HOST SITE DESCRIPTION

Host site is subject to change

Site # 20

Schedule: year-round

A pull-through with a paved parking pad of 93 ft x 20 ft and a gravel living area of 15 ft x 15 ft. It offers partial shade, 50/30/20 amp electric, and water. This site is located at the top of Deer Run Road.

Site #35

Schedule: year-round

A pull-through with a paved parking pad of 85 ft x 10 ft and a gravel living area of 13 ft x 10 ft. It offers partial shade and has a slight incline. Equipped with 50/30/20 amp electric, and water. It is located at the top of Rabbit Jump Road. This site is subject to change.

Site #58

Schedule: year-round

A back-in site with a paved parking pad of 53 ft x 20 ft. It offers partial shade, has a slight decline, 50/30/20 amp electric, and water. It is located at the top of Blue Herron Road.
